



## THURSDAY, JANUARY 16 6:30 pm (doors open 6:00) When Day Breaks


Misha Brankov is entrusted with a battered metal box that had been excavated from the site of a Nazi death camp. The documents inside reveal that his real name was not Brankov, but Weiss, and that he was Jewish. He was entrusted to the Brankov family just before his own family was taken away by the Nazis.

#### THURSDAY, JANUARY 23 6:30 pm (doors open 6:00) Box for Life

Belgian-born Noah Klieger survived the Holocaust by narrowly avoiding the gas chambers at Auschwitz, then faked his way onto the camp's boxing squad. After the war, Klieger helped smuggle survivors into Palestine, where he fought in the War of Independence. As a journalist, he became an influential voice in modern Jewish history.

#### SUNDAY, JANUARY 26 2:00 pm (doors open 1:30) The Good Nazi

In 1943, as the Vilna ghetto was about to be liquidated, Nazi officer Major Karl Plagge made a decision to risk his own life and save the lives of Vilna's Jews. On the surface, he was commandant of the forced labor camp, HKP 562. In reality, he was sheltering hundreds of Jewish families.

This documentary tells the story of the *Oyneg Shabes*, a clandestine group in the Warsaw ghetto led by historian Emanuel Ringelblum. These brave men and women risked their lives to create an archive so the truth would survive, even if they did not.
