

Teaching with *Salvaged Pages:* *Young Writers' Diaries of the Holocaust*

A workshop with author Alexandra Zapruder



Now in its Second Edition, *Salvaged Pages* is a key text for teachers, offering a glimpse into the daily lives of Jewish youth and how they endured in response to the ever harsher Nazi regime. Despite hunger, cold, exhaustion, and despair, young people documented their experiences and their impressions of life, and in so doing, marked their places in the world.

This workshop will focus on using the text and young people's diaries to teach the Holocaust. Each participant will receive a copy of the text as well as the hour-long documentary, *I'm Still Here*, based on the diaries. *People* magazine wrote that this "haunting documentary...gives us a sense of what the world lost when these lives were cut short."
